I. The Judgment of God Defeats His Enemies (9:8-12)

A. “The inability of the magicians of Egypt to ‘stand before’ Moses reflects the failure of every form of superstition, magic, and paganism before the word of God. The resurgence of paganism and magic in our day via the use of amulets, witchcraft and Wicca, horoscopes, and so forth reflects a general turning away from God and biblical revelation.” (Duane Garrett)

II. The Judgment of God Displays His Glory (9:13-16, 29)
