 - D. The cross was a dramatic display of judgment against sin.

 - A. People who refuse to be humbled by God's Word will eventually be humiliated by God's judgment.
 - B. Are you humbled or hardened?
 - C. "How long will you refuse to humble yourself before me?" (10:3)

 - A. We have a story to tell.
 - B. Exodus 18:8-11
 - C. Psalm 96:3
