"Putting God on Trial"

Exodus 17:1-7

Memory Verse: Isaiah 53:6

Introduction

- A. Big Idea: Even when his people fail to trust him, God faithfully provides for his people.
- B. "If we are faithless, he remains faithful" (2 Timothy 2:13).
- I. God Tests His People (17:1)
 - A. God guides his people.
 - B. Each test is an opportunity to trust God or to doubt God.
 - C. "I tested you at the waters of Meribah" (Psalm 81:7c).
- II. The People Test God (17:2-4, 7)
 - A. They demanded God's provision (17:2a). They presumed upon God.
 - B. They denied God's protection (17:3). They accused God.
 - C. They doubted God's presence (17:7). They doubted God.
 - D. Theodicy—how do we justify or defend God in light of the existence of evil? Why does an omnipotent and omnibenevolent God allow evil and suffering?
 - E. Getting God off the hook for the existence of evil:
 - 1. Sovereign versus permissive will of God
 - 2. Satan
 - 3. God is dependent on our faith
 - F. These so-called explanations do not line up with Scripture. Neither do they satisfy the skeptic or the believer.
