II. True Disciples Will Love Christ Supremely (14:25-26)

A. Jesus changes our perspective.

C. In comparison to our love for Christ, we hate the people we love.

D. When we understand the gospel, we will love Jesus Christ more than any earthly relationship.

E. Our love for Christ must be preeminent.
