Seven Implications

1. God had already made his will known. (Genesis 25:23)
2. God's revelation calls for trust and obedience.
3. Isaac should have had a higher view of God's covenant than to entrust it to Esau.
4. Presumption and neglect negatively affect all of us.
5. Jacob's own deceitfulness followed him.
6. Esau's remorse was not true repentance. (Hebrews 12:16-17)
7. God is not constrained or held hostage by the schemes of man. (Acts 2:23-24)

Two Life-Changing Realities

1. We are to live by divine revelation. (Matthew 6:4)
2. We experience chaos when we reject divine revelation. (Proverbs 29:18)
