- I. God Reminds Us of the Distinction between Israel and Esau (36:1-8)
 - A. The genealogy indicates how the Edomites will reappear through the Bible as an adversary for the people of God.
 - B. The genealogy connects the rebellion of Esau against God to the rebellion of Edom against the people of God.
 - C. The genealogy connects the lineage of Esau to the future destruction of Edom. 1. Isaiah 34:5-9
 - 2. Ezekiel 25:12-14; 35:1-15
 - D. The genealogy shows how God has bestowed his covenant love on Jacob as well as his judgment on Esau.
 - 1. Romans 9:13
 - 2. Malachi 1:1-5
- II. God Fulfills His Promises to Esau (36:9-30)
 - A. God promises blessing to Esau.
 - 1. Hebrews 11:20
 - B. God promises judgment to Esau
 - 1. Esau despised his birthright, which is a way of saying he had little concern for spiritual things. (Hebrews 12:15-17)
 - 2. Esau indulged his sensual nature.
 - 3. Being godless himself, Esau failed to pass spiritual concerns on to his family.
